A Word From The Coach

Good evening and welcome to the Gosport Ice Arena for tonight's NIHL 1 league fixture as we host the Swindon Wildcats 2 on what promises to be a special country-themed game night.

From a league perspective, recent form has made it difficult for us to climb the table, and we currently find ourselves sitting 5th, with Swindon just behind us in 6th. That context makes tonight a crucial fixture for both sides, with three points very much at a premium as we look to regain momentum in the second half of the season.

Last weekend saw our League Cup journey come to an end at the semi-final stage against a very strong Slough side. Finally, thank you, as always, for your continued support. We know results have been frustrating at times, but I can assure you that everyone behind the scenes and on the ice is working tirelessly to get us through this period and back to where we expect to be.
